

## Columbia School of Journalism/ Peter Osnos Speech/ Draft 1

Let me begin by saying to the Columbia School of Journalism that you have done a good thing in giving your award to Peter Osnos for two reasons- one, of course, he richly deserves it as I think my own experiences with him will show, and two, I believe a great school has real influence on its students. If I'm right, Columbia can be bursting with pride for its part in launching Peter's career.
